



## Application Information

### Who should use the Application to Resume Graduate Study (GS Form 6)?

Students who have not fulfilled the minimum registration requirements but who would like to resume or complete their program. Applicants who have not been approved for readmission through the application to resume process can reapply to the same graduate program through the regular online admission process. However, no previous course work will be considered on the new program of study.

### Who should not use this form?

Students who want to return to BYU for graduate study, but in a different department, must submit a new Application for Admission to Graduate Study.

### Review of the readmission request

Students applying for readmission may expect previous graduate work to be reevaluated and, where appropriate, their program of study to be revised. Readmission does not extend the time limit for completion of the degree (five years from the first admittance to a master's program, eight years from the first admittance to a doctoral program). Students whose expected graduation date is beyond the five- or eight-year time limit must submit a Petition for Exception (OGS Form 2) and a detailed time line along with this application.

### Once readmitted

Because readmission is granted for a specific semester, students are required to register for at least two hours in that semester or term or pay the equivalent fee; otherwise, they forfeit their acceptance. International students must register for a full course of study (9 hours for a semester or 4.5 hours for a term).

### Minimum registration requirement

Graduate students must register for and complete with acceptable grades at least six semester hours during each academic year to avoid being dropped from graduate programs. Grades of E, D, UW, NS, or I are not acceptable, and home study and audits do not count. Students must register for at least two credit hours during any semester or term in which they use university facilities or consult with faculty; additionally, they must register for at least two credit hours during the semester or term in which they complete their degrees. Those who do not meet minimum registration requirements will be dropped from active status and must apply for readmission.

### Deadlines

Check with your graduate department for reapplication deadlines.

## Applicant Instructions

1. Complete the applicant's portion of this form and return it to Graduate Studies, 105 FPH, Brigham Young University, Provo, UT 84602-1339.
2. A completed Reapplication Honor Code Commitment Form is an essential part of the reapplication and should either accompany the application or be mailed directly to Graduate Studies by the interviewing church officer.
3. If you are an international applicant, complete additional application materials (from Graduate Studies) regarding finances. These materials must be cleared by Graduate Studies before any review can take place.
4. Upon approval, the \$600 nonrefundable fee will be charged to your student account.

## Department Instructions

1. After reviewing the applicant's record, complete the department's portion of the Application to Resume Graduate Study.
2. Submit the completed form to Graduate Studies (105 FPH). Keep a photocopy in the student's file. When processed, Graduate Studies will send a photocopy to the department and the student.

#### Honor Code

Brigham Young University exists to provide a university education in an atmosphere consistent with the ideals and principles of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. This atmosphere is preserved through commitment to conduct that reflects those ideals and principles.

#### Dress and Grooming Standards

The dress and grooming of both men and women should always be modest, neat, and clean, consistent with the dignity of representing Brigham Young University and The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Modesty and cleanliness are important values that reflect personal dignity and integrity, through which students, staff, and faculty of BYU represent the principles and standards of the Church. These members of the BYU community commit themselves to observing the following standards, which reflect the direction of the BYU Board of Trustees and the Church publication For the Strength of Youth.

Clothing should be modest in fabric, fit, and style and appropriate for the occasion. Skirts and shorts should be knee length or lower. Clothing which is sleeveless, strapless, or revealing is not acceptable. Shoes should be worn in public campus areas.

A clean and well-cared-for appearance should be maintained. Hair styles should be clean and neat, avoiding extreme styles. Men's hair should be trimmed above the collar, leaving the ear uncovered. If worn, mustaches should be neatly trimmed. Earrings for men are unacceptable, and beards are not acceptable, except for certified medical reasons. Men's sideburns should not extend below the earlobe or onto the cheek.

#### Expectations for Continuing Enrollment

All students must abide by the Honor Code and Dress and Grooming Standards as long as they are enrolled at BYU, whether on or off campus.

An annual ecclesiastical endorsement interview is required of all continuing students.

LDS students must do their duty in the Church, attend their meetings, and abide by the rules and standards of the Church.
